Urban 'heat island' effect is a small part of global warming, white roofs don't reduce it.

The urban heat island effect is caused mostly by replacing soil and vegetation with paved roads, sidewalks and buildings. Paving prevents evaporation of water from the soil and plant leaves. Since evaporation is a cooling process, reducing evaporation warms cities. Additionally, the darker colors of some roads and buildings absorb more sunlight, heating a city further.

"Between 2 and 4 percent of the gross global warming since the Industrial Revolution may be due to urban heat islands," said Mark Z. Jacobson, a professor of civil and environmental engineering who led the study.

One "Geoengineering" proposal for reducing the impact of urban heat islands is to paint roofs

worldwide a reflective white. However, they caused a net global warming, as the increased sunlight reflected back into the atmosphere by white roofs increased absorption of light by dark pollutants such as black carbon, which further increased heating of the atmosphere.

One way to reduce emissions while simultaneously reducing summer air conditioning demand is to install photovoltaic panels on roofs. Such panels not only generate electricity, reducing emissions of fossil fuels from electricity-producing power plants, but they also reduce sunlight absorbed -by buildings because they convert sunlight to electricity. Because photovoltaic muels do not reflect the sunlight back to the air, unlike white roofs, reflected light is not available to be absorbed again by pollutants in the iir, creating heat.
