Education is given a lot of importance in India. It is good for us as individuals and a nation that governments, private institutions, parents and teachers are willing to spend time and money on it.

However, the question that is frequently asked is: Are we really getting educated? The question is raised in Parliament, in columns of newspapers and panel discussions on TV channels. Are not most of our students going through all the motions of learning, without actually learning anything of importance. For example, it is common knowledge that students who pass out of schools often cannot read or write independently. So, are we cheating our students?
