In spite of a demanding career, a woman is expected to be an efficient housewife but most men still do not make good house-husbands. When it comes to helping with the housework many men feel totally helpless. When they decide to do a few jobs around the house they only pick the ones they enjoy. Sometimes if they are in the mood they don't mind doing a bit of gardening or mending a few things but they refuse to do any boring jobs like cleaning the house, washing and ironing the clothes, looking after the children or cooking dinner. Most of these jobs have to be done immediately and regularly while household repair, the job that men enjoy most, can always wait till a more convenient time or till one feels like doing them.

According to a survey done recently, the lady of the house does three-quarters of the boring household chores even if she has a full-time job. But, surprisingly, housewives don't seem to mind, for most women still see their family role as the one that matters the most. Only 20 per cent of the women interviewed said they would like their husbands to help them more with the housework; 75 per cent were satisfied with things as they were and the remaining 5 per cent preferred to have their husbands keep away from housework. Most women tended to use electric appliances to make up for male laziness. Makers of household appliances and electrical gadgets are delighted, of course.
