And thou shalt hear, All here in one bed lay.

- (i) Identify the lines and name the poet. (2)
- (ii) Explain the significance of 'Indias of spice and mine' with reference to the context. (3)

The river glideth at his own sweet will:  
Dear God! the very houses seem asleep;  
And all that mighty heart is lying still!

- (i) Identify the lines and name the poet. (2)
- (ii) What is the poet referring to in the last line of the given passage? (3)
- (iii) Discuss the poet's attitude towards the city in the given poem. (5)

- (b) "The three different stanzas of Keats' *To Autumn* focus on three different sensory perceptions." Discuss. (10)

3. (a) Read the passage given below, and answer the questions that follow :

If you prick us, do we not bleed?

If you tickle us, do we not laugh ?

If you poison us, do we not die ?

And if you wrong us, shall we not revenge ?”

- (i) Identify the speaker and the text. (2)
- (ii) Briefly explain the significance of the last line of the passage in the context of the play. (3)
- (iii) Discuss the importance of these lines in the context of the events of the play. (5)

- (b) Discuss the importance of the caskets in the play. (10)

5. (a) Analyse the speaker's remembrance of his own childhood and upbringing in Coleridge's *Frost at Midnight*.

- (b) Compare the way Swift and Blake depict the city of London in the poems on your course. (15)
