I hesitated long enough for the train to leave without me.

When it had gone and the noise and busy confusion of the platform had subsided,

I found myself standing alone on the deserted platform. The knowledge that I had

a hundred stolen rupees in my pyjamas only increased my feeling of isolation and loneliness. I had no idea where to spend the night. I had never kept any friends because sometimes friends can be one's undoing. I didn't want to make myself conspicuous by staying at a hotel. And the only person I really knew well in town was the person I had robbed !

Leaving the station, I walked slowly through the bazaar keeping to dark, deserted alleys. I kept thinking of Arun. He would still be asleep, blissfully unaware of his loss. I have made a study of men's faces when they have lost something of material value. The greedy man shows panic, the rich man shows anger, the poor man shows fear. But I knew that neither panic nor anger nor fear would show on Arun's face when he discovered the theft; only a terrible sadness not for the loss of his money but for my having betrayed his trust. I found myself on the maidan and sat down on a bench with my feet tucked up under my haunches. The night was a little cold

and I regretted not having brought Arun's blanket along a little drizzle added to my discomfort. Soon it was raining heavily. My shirt and pyjamas stuck to my skin.
