Whatever form the group work takes on your course, the opportunity to work with others, rather than on your own, can provide many benefits. First of all, it increases productivity and performance. Groups that work well together can achieve much more than individuals working on their own. A broader range of skills can be applied to practical activities and sharing and discussing ideas can play a pivotal role in deepening your understanding of a particular subject area.

Secondly, skills development is increased. Being part of a team will help you develop your interpersonal skills such as speaking

and listening as well as team working skills such as leadership, and working with and motivating others. Some of these skills will be useful throughout your academic career and all are valued by employers as well.

Finally, you get to know more about yourself. Collaborating with others will help identify your own strengths and weaknesses. Greater self-awareness will both help you to learn better and will be invaluable when you come to write your CV or complete job application forms.
