What makes good writing good? Is it ideas (having something to say)? Is it command over language (the way you say it)? Is it organization (the way in which your narrative/argument unfolds)? Or is it a combination of all of the above? And why is so much emphasis placed on writing? After all, most of us don't want to be novelists or journalists or professors. So why is writing important?

In spite of greater mechanization, our society today requires more writing instead of less. If you want to remember something or want someone else to do so, you will have to write it down. If you want to be successful in-your studies, you must be able to write good answers

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to questions in the examinations. If you want to be successful in your career, you will have to be able to write reports and briefs. The higher you move up the ladder of success, the more you will be required to write. Recommendations, instructions, requirements — the list is endless. In fact, even in everyday life, a person who can write well is always looked upon with respect.

However, clear, lucid writing, which is a pleasure to read does not come easily. It requires care, practice and hard work. One of the main reasons we find writing difficult is that we expect our very first draft to produce a finished piece. This is rarely so. As a matter of fact, good writing always requires many drafts that are worked upon and thrown away before the final piece emerges. So the first rule of good writing is to learn to revise and edit one's work many times before we 'submit' it.
