are on the top of the food chain eating their favourite food, seals.

Polar bears are occasionally hunted by people.

Polar bears are in serious danger of going extinct. They are threatened as a direct effect on how we as humans treat the earth and the environment, thinking that the earth is indestructible. But, the earth is destructible, and we are destroying it. The "Greenhouse Effect" warms the earth, and therefore, melts the precious snow and ice that the polar bears need for survival.

Rising temperatures cause sea ice to melt, especially in the summer months when the polar bears are the most active. Polar bears depend on sea ice as habitat for hunting and dens. As available sea ice decreases, polar bears have to swim farther to find suitable habitat and it takes much longer to find a meal. Sea ice loss also impacts polar bears main food source—seals.

So among the threats for the polar bears, climate change is on the top, along with chemicals and pollutants in the air. Even though

there are no factories up in the far north, the polar bears still suffer the effects of pollution. Wind and rain bring harmful chemicals to the polar region, affecting the health and immune system of both adult and baby polar bears.

Polar bears need our help and protection to ensure a long, healthy future for the species. The best way we can help polar bears is by reducing our carbon emissions and working with Wildlife Federations to campaign for reductions in global warming pollutants.
